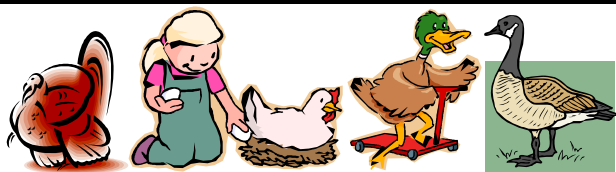

**All Poultry will be conference judged on
Thursday at 1 p.m.**

1. Exhibitor is limited to 10 entries but no more than one entry under each item number.
2. **Feed and water will be furnished for the birds at a cost of 75 cents per bird; 50 cents for cage rental and 25 cents for feed, included with your entry fee.** Birds will be fed by Fair personnel. Exhibitor must furnish a feed and water dish for each bird. These dishes must be of a size appropriate to size of bird. At least 1 qt capacity, and larger for ducks and geese. The dishes must be durable (no flimsy plastic) and non-tippable. Do not bring plates or flat dishes for feeding.
3. Exhibitor or his representative must be present for the judging.
4. If 6 or more entries of one breed appears in the "The Any Other Breed Classes," an individual class for that breed will be provided.
5. In the small pets and bird classes such as pigeons or where no other classes are provided, the exhibitor must provide his own cage.
6. All poultry including waterfowl and game birds shown in public exhibition, shall originate from flocks designated as "US pollorum-typhoid clean under the National Poultry Improvement Plan or from equivalent flocks, or shall have had a negative pollorum-typhoid test within 90 days of movement to public exhibition. Only sexually mature birds over 4 months of age having a full complement of fully developed feathers are required to be tested.
NO TESTING WILL BE DONE ON ENTRY DAY OF THE FAIR. BE SURE TO HAVE TESTING DONE PRIOR TO THE FAIR.
7. Non-certified NPIP flock requires Wisconsin Poultry Test Form as proof of test with results.

6. Decorate a minimum of 3 eggs-be creative (boiled, dried or blown)

- Entry tag to be completely filled out and mounted on upper right corner of tagboard or posterboard.
