FRESH FLOWERS

Definition of terms:

Bloom – Solitary flower with at minimum a stem long enough to remain stable in a vase.

Spike – Flower structure with stemless flowers on a common stalk.

Spray – Portions of plants with a number of flowers on one stem.

Stem – Stiff primary plant axle which may or may not branch supporting one or more flowers.

Trusses – A tight cluster of blooms, often dome shaped.

(3 blooms, spikes, sprays or trusses of the same cultivar except where otherwise stated).

Only one entry under any class number.

the proposed improved landscape, location and labeling of buildings, drives, fixtures, and plantings on each sketch.

2. Your Home Garden plan, including a sketch of the original landscape and sketch of proposed gardens; herbs, vegetables and flower.
3. Collection of mounted leaves, showing the upper and underside of each leaf of all shrubs in a Home Grounds Improvement project.
4. A story of your lawn project showing before and after pictures with story on seed used, fertilizer and weed control.
5. Entry made at 4-H Adventure Day.

4. Arrangement of weed/wildflowers in a vase, minimum of three varieties. Entry must include a card stating the varieties.
5. Arrangement using a round vase (fresh only).
6. Any other fresh flower arrangement form (include a card stating the form.)
7. Two varieties of flowers in a vase with additional greens.
8. Corsage (fresh or silk).
9. Boutonniere (fresh or silk).
10. Arrangement of weed/wildflowers in a vase, minimum of three varieties. Entry must include a card stating varieties.
