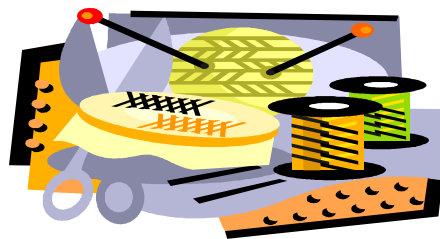

STITCHERY

CLASS NUMBER

3. Candle wicking (Old form of embroidery using a series of knots stitched as a design) pillowcase

6. Counted Cross Stitch – any article 8"x10" or larger stitchery piece, not including the mat/frame
