3. Project members are not limited on the number of entries, but may enter only one exhibit per class number.
4. Games and toys should be safe, durable and washable, and geared to a specific aged child.

DIVISION A: CHILD DEVELOPMENT UNIT 1: Grades 3-5

CLASS NUMBER

1. Game or babysitting kit for a child made by exhibitor with description of who the game or babysitting kit is for, age of child and purpose of each item or game. May use recycled materials.
2. Toy (not a doll) made by exhibitor for child with description and age of child and the purpose of the toy.
3. Book made for a child. Give description and age of child and purpose of book.
4. Exhibit a puppet that can be used with a song or story or a finger play. Include the book or words to the song, or finger play.
5. Exhibit an illustrated booklet on a child you worked with. Include a description with each illustration on what you learned (use pictures from magazines, drawings, or photos about the development and needs of the child)
6. Growth chart or poster showing "How A Child Grows" "Needs of a Child" Be descriptive.
7. Homemade doll
8. Doll House made by exhibitor for child with description of who the dollhouse is for and the age of the child
