DIVISION A: Crops

FIELD CROPS, CORN & SUNFLOWERS

Exhibit 5 stalks; roots attached; wrap roots in plastic and cover with burlap bag to prevent drying.

CLASS NUMBER

1. Field corn, label variety
2. Sweet corn, label variety
3. Popcorn, label variety
4. Ornamental corn, label variety
5. Sunflowers-oilseed, 5 stalks with heads
6. Sunflowers-black striped, 5 stalks with heads

DRY GRAINS

Quantity not less than one gallon, grown in current or previous year. Label variety on all field crops.

7. Ear corn - 5 ears
8. Dry shell corn – 4-5 qt ice cream pail
9. Barley – 4-5 qt ice cream pail
10. Flax – 4-5 qt ice cream pail
11. Lentil beans-any variety – 4-5 qt ice cream pail
12. Lupine beans-any variety – 4-5 qt ice cream pail
13. Oats, well cleaned – 4-5 qt ice cream pail
14. Rye – 4-5 qt ice cream pail
15. Soybeans – 4-5 qt ice cream pail
16. Spring wheat – 4-5 qt ice cream pail
17. Winter wheat – 4-5 qt ice cream pail

ENSILED GRAINS

18. High moisture ground ear corn, ensiled–4-5 qt ice cream pail w/lid
19. High moisture ground shelled corn, ensiled-4-5 qt ice cream pail with lid

20. High moisture shelled corn with cob, ensiled, not ground or rolled-4-5 qt ice cream pail w/lid
21. High moisture shelled corn without cob, ensiled, not ground or rolled-4-5 qt ice cream pail w/lid

DRY FORAGES

22. Legume hay – minimum 30 inch bale
23. Legume grass hay – minimum 30 inch bale
24. Grass hay – minimum 30 inch bale
25. Dry hay – (legume or grass) from large rectangular bale – 1-2 slices (minimum 2-4 inches)

ENSILED FORAGES

26. Corn silage – 4-5 qt ice cream pail w/lid
27. Small grain silage – 4-5 qt ice cream pail w/lid
28. Pea and small grains silage – 4-5 qt ice cream pail w/lid
29. Legume haylage – 4-5 qt ice cream pail w/lid
30. Legume grass haylage – 4-5 qt ice cream pail w/lid
31. Baleage (legume or grass) from large rectangular bale.
1 slab in clear plastic bag - 1 or 2 slices
(minimum 2-4 inches thick)

6. One pint of raspberries (cello-covered)
7. One pint of cherries (cello-covered)
8. Plums - 8 specimens
9. Any other fruit, 3 or more specimens
10. Fruit basket display with 3 or more fruits bought/grown by exhibitor.
